Arizona Department of Gaming Reports \$21.5 Million Tribal Gaming Contributions to the State for the Second Quarter of Fiscal Year 2022

PHOENIX – The Arizona Department of Gaming (ADG) announced today \$21,471,026 in tribal gaming contributions to the Arizona Benefits Fund for the State’s second quarter of Fiscal Year (FY) 2022. This amount represents a 32 percent decrease when compared to same quarter of FY2021.

Tribal gaming contributions to the Arizona Benefits Fund for the second quarter of the State’s FY2022 are as follows:
